AKC Master National Hunter Title (MNH)

The American Kennel Club has approved a new MNH title for retrievers. The MNH, which stands for Master National Hunter, title will be in addition to the dog's MH title.

The title is given to any dog that successfully completes three Master Nationals, which is equivalent to the Master National Retriever Clubs' (MNRC's) Hall of Fame designation. When the MNH is earned, it will go on the dog's pedigree.

The MNRC Board and the AKC have agreed that the new title will be retroactive. Every dog currently in the Hall of Fame will now have the new AKC title. The MNRC Board of Directors agreed that they (MNRC) will pay the \$20 AKC fee for recording the new title retroactively, as well as in the future.

The AKC will offer the option to purchase a MNH certificate. If an owner would like an AKC certificate, they can complete a form provided by the AKC and pay the \$30 fee.

Master National Retriever Club Title (MNR)

The MNRC has approved a new "club" title to replace the previous MNH that was earned when a dog passed 2 Master Nationals. The new "club" title is the Master National Retriever (MNR) which will be granted to all dogs qualifying at two Master National events. This is a "club" title and cannot become part of the dog's pedigree.

was Jack Jagoda. It was Jack that I turned to after reading about Ned Spear and his idea about running hunt tests against a standard as opposed to placements. From that initial idea, of running hunt tests against a standard, developed the North American Hunting Retriever Association and later the AKC Hunt Test. HAHRA had 176 dogs entered in our first event in Richmond, V A. Unlike the AKC, Jack and I knew that there were many retriever enthusiasts out there that would support Retriever Hunt Tests.

Doc, *MHR Shannondoah 's Free Sprite, MH*, went on to become the first chocolate Lab to earn the AKC Title of Master Hunter and the second chocolate Lab to hold both the AKC and NAHRA Master Hunter Titles. Doc went on to compete in both of the first Master National Invitational for both organizations. We were also qualified to run in the first Master National in DE, but Doc was fighting cancer at the time. However, we did show our, mine and Doc's, support for the Master National by becoming a Charter Member.

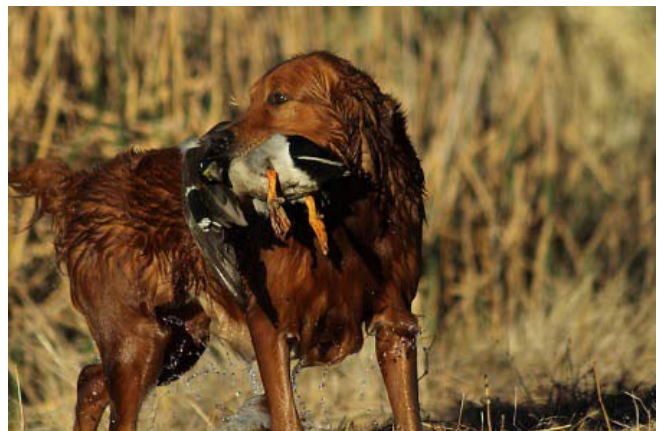
My Labs have competed in field trials, hunt tests and held several State Gun Dog Championship Titles. I specialize in the breeding of chocolate and yellow Labs, but also own several black Labs. I've been very lucky over the years, to have my Labs featured in *Just Labs*, *Gray's Sporting Journal*, *The Art of The Gun Dog 2007 Calendar* and greeting cards by wildlife artist and dog trainer Kristen Hoffman.

Living on Maryland's Eastern Shore, I am very active in the hunt test movement, but have also competed in AKC field trials. Most recently, Cin-D's Storm Trooper MI-I, MNH, QAA received a JAM in only my second time running in an Amateur All Age Stake. "Rocky" and I also qualified at the 2003 and 2005 Master Nationals. Currently, I am competing in hunt tests with Rocky's offspring: "Drake", Shannondoah's Highland Drake, MH and field trials with Shannondoah's Highland Cruise, JH. "Cruise" has earned: 3rd Place, 4th Place, Reserve JAM's and JAM's in the Qualifying Stake.

Before becoming the Director for Region 1, I have served as: 1) President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and Member of the Board in thirteen years with the MD RC, 2) President, Member of the Board and Delegate to the Master National in thirteen years with the Talbot RC, 3) Member of the Board for five years with the Susquehanna RC. and 4) Judge for both the 1999 and 2008 Master Nationals.
