President's Message...

Greetings:

Since we last talked a lot has been going on. The Master National Board of Directors held its "winter" board meeting on the 2005 MN Hunt Test grounds, "The Big Woods on the Trinity."

If I might digress a little, I would like to tell you about the site. Doc McFarlane has acquired approximately 7500 acres of hardwoods and marsh on the Trinity River. He belongs to a consortium that is returning large areas to natural conditions. He provides premier trophy buck, hog and waterfowl hunting. His "resort" area contains 22 beds, a movie theater, a restaurant and sporting clay among other things. I had the privilege of judging a Master stake on the site in February and the place is phenomenal. Weekend hunt tests could be held there weekly with minimal overlap of lands and water in a year. Doc is planning on building up the roads with gravel and will build parking areas for our event. I believe those of you who run there this fall will have a tremendous sense of awe of the beauty and vastness.

Now back to the board meeting. The board toured the grounds twice in anticipation of agenda items. We revisited all decisions by the delegates and questions raised last fall. Other items on the agenda were reviewing the constitution and bylaws, and reviewing the Board's policies and procedures.

We discussed a three-way split. Two formats were considered: the first is simply doing an A-B-C split similar in all other aspects to last year's A-B split; the second format considered would be similar to the HRC "Grand" format but three-way verses their four-way. After much discussion, the board voted

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MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING
 October 1, 2004
 Camelot Picnic Pavilion, Lomira, WI

President Muth called the special meeting to order. He stated that this was the unofficial part of the meeting. The MNRC board was introduced. Board members present were: President Ray Muth, Secretary Frank Barton, Treasurer Mike Bunting, VP Region 1 Bob Meyer, VP Region 3 Bill Blochowiak, VP Region 4 Julie Cairns, Director Region 2 Cindy Read, Director Region 3 Bill Teague. The following Board members were absent: Director Region 1 Molly Moxley, Director Region 4 George Tookey. President Muth announced that the VP Region 2 position was vacant.

President Muth reviewed the formation of the special committee to deal with the issues arising from the MNRC BOD's actions at their January 2004 meeting. The members of the Special Committee were: Bill Blochowiak-Chair, Frank Barton, Julie Cairns, Bob Meyer, James Keldsen, Blair Clark, Missy Lemoi, Dianne O'Hearne, Gary Brady, Randy Pruitt, Lyle Steinman, Warren Price, and Larry Wharton.

President Muth stated that during the unofficial part of the meeting any person present could ask questions or make statements. Becky Malphus stated that because of the number of entries, the MNRC could not continue to put on a quality event.

President Muth then called the official meeting to order. Frank Barton called the roll and announced that a quorum was present with 69 clubs in attendance. Ray then asked Bill Blochowiak to review the work of the Special Committee. Bill presented the work of the committee. Blair Clark spoke to what his side of the committee tried to accomplish.

Ray Muth then presented the proposed amendments to the MNRC Constitution and By-Laws. These amendments are attached in their original form and are part of these minutes. President Muth stated the amendments would be considered in the following order: 4, 8, 1, 3, 7, 6, 5, 2. President Muth announced that Roll Call votes would be recorded on all votes on the amendments.

Amendment 4: Passed, 59 For – 10 Against

Amendment 8: A motion was made and seconded to delete the 1st sentence of Section C. This amendment passed on a voice vote. The Amendment as amended **Failed, 29 for – 40 Against – 1 Abstention**

Amendment 1: Failed, 33 For – 36 Against – 1 Abstention

Amendment 3: Passed, 55 For – 14 Against – 1 Abstention

Amendment 7: A motion was made and seconded to amend the 1st sentence in Section 7 replacing the word "shall" with "may". This amendment passed on a voice vote. A motion was made and

seconded to delete the second sentence entirely. This amendment passed on a voice vote. **The Amendment as amended Passed, 57 For – 13 Against.**

Amendment 6: Failed, 5 For – 61 Against – 3 Abstention – 1 Not Present

Amendment 5: Passed, 56 For – 13 Against – 1 Abstention

Amendment 2: Failed, 5 For – 64 Against note: This vote was taken by a show of hands.

A motion was made by Blair Clark, and seconded, to remove agenda item 7a. All delegates voted in favor of the motion.

A motion was made by Blair Clark, and seconded, to rescind the actions of the MNRC BOD at their January meeting to change the format, judging standards, eligibility both in official form and as submitted to the AKC. Motion carried by voice vote.

A motion was made by Blair Clark, and seconded, to prohibit the MNRC officers and directors from submitting any request to AKC for approval of a MHX title if the same requires implementation of the resolution that the event be an owner handler stake, with the other changes as published in the official minutes and as submitted on the Club's website. Motion carried by voice vote.

President Muth rules agenda item 7d out of order.

The meeting adjourned.

NEW CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

AMENDMENT 3, ARTICLE IX, SECTION 4(c):

(c) The mechanics of conducting the Master National Hunting Retriever Test shall be determined by policies and procedures adopted by the Board of Directors, and notice of such shall be given to member clubs and contestants. However, the following shall apply:

1. The test shall be divided into as many flights as are necessary to accommodate the entries. Flights shall be judged by two judges each. Flights should not exceed 125 dogs per flight.

2. Judges should apportion their time to allow contestants to run at least one test per day. During the course of the event, judges should attempt to run more than one test per day.

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to make the request to AKC for an A-B-C split. This format would be much easier to prepare for than the "Grand" version, which might take one or two years to prepare.

The three-way split will require much rethinking in planning. Participants must still work as before. However, workers will be hired to launch and throw birds and plant blinds. The three-way split will also require more of everything. To cover these additional expenses, the entry fee was raised to \$300. We plan on rotating through six tests and "coming together" on the seventh and maybe the eight tests.

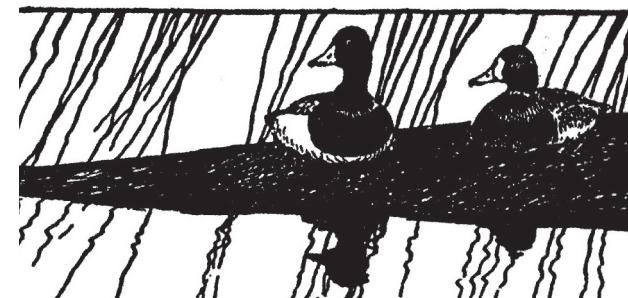
A letter has been sent to the AKC Board of Directors requesting the three-way split. This request should be presented to the AKC Board in April and May.

An entire day of the two and a half day meeting was spent of Policies and Procedures. Hours were spent reviewing, modifying, deleting and creating new ones. An appointed committee completed much preparation work. The issues related to the "judges selection" process are the most important to you and are included in this newsletter.

Another item of interest concerns the subjects discussed at our last meeting during the "open" session. A letter from each region's vice president has been sent to each member club with several of these items of interest plus other issues the board felt important. We ask the delegates and/or club contacts to take this letter to their respective club members for serious discussion and provide us a written response, suggestions or recommendations. I would like for the vice presidents to receive your letters by April 30. The Board will then review and take any action deemed appropriate.

I would like to say this year's board meeting was the most productive I have been a party too. I also want you to know that we have no hidden agenda. However, we cannot tell you about anything until there is something to tell you about.

- 8) That the board provide delegates and participants a deadline by which to provide alternative methods to allow manageable entries at the MNRC event. (Kristie Wilder)
- 9) That the MN Board develop proposals that will provide a reasonable number of qualifying dogs to run in a non-split MN and submit such proposals to the clubs for approval. (Lanier Fogg)

3. Every attempt will be made to insure that the Master National shall be run over eight full days (Sunday-Sunday, inclusive).

AMENDMENT 4, ARTICLE IX, SECTION 5:

SECTION 5. Elimination of Contestants

(a) The American Kennel Club Standard Procedure for Hunting Tests for Retrievers shall govern the elimination of contestants. Contestants not eliminated in accordance with said procedure shall compete in all series, both on land and water, provided that the judges may eliminate any contestants proving, in the unanimous judgment of the judges, to be unworthy of further testing. The judges' decision will be final.

(b) This being a National event, the judges are encouraged to set a sufficient number of tests of such a level as to fully evaluate the abilities of trained retrievers.

AMENDMENT 5, ARTICLE I, SECTION 2(b)

(b) To conduct each year one Master National Hunting Retriever Test, open to retrievers which qualify therefore under the rules of the American Kennel Club, and these By-Laws. If at any time the Test is not licensed by the American Kennel Club, then it shall proceed without such licensing and be open to retrievers which qualify therefore under these By-Laws. In such event, the Rules and Standard Procedure of the American Kennel Club shall be followed in the conduct and judging of the test so far as applicable.

AMENDMENT 7, ARTICLE IX, SECTION 7 (new)

(7) The Hunting Test Committee may procure such hired helpers as are reasonably deemed necessary for the proper conduct of the stake, considering the number of entries and the number of prospective workers from the contestants themselves.

**Minutes of the
2004 Master National Retriever Club
Handlers Meeting & Annual Meeting
October 2, 2004
Camelot Picnic Pavilion Lomira, WI**

President Ray Muth called the handlers meeting to order at 12:30 PM. Ray introduced Julie Cairns, Chief Marshal. Julie introduced the 2004 judges: Region I - John Marchica, Region II - Alan Bruhin, Region III - Roger Fuller, Region IV - Drew Neubauer. Julie announced that the pairings would be: John and Roger; Alan and Drew. A blind drawing was held and Flight A would be judged by John and Roger; and flight B would be judged by Alan and Drew. Another blind drawing was held and Flight A would start with Test B and Flight B would start with Test A.

Julie then gave the handlers instructions pertaining to the 2004

event. The judges gave their comments about their assignments. Questions from the handlers were answered. The handlers were divided into work groups and given instructions.

President Ray Muth called the Annual Meeting to order at 1:15 PM. Ray introduced sponsors and AKC representatives in attendance: Bill Speck, Jerry Mann and Gordon Hildebrandt. Ray then introduced the MNRC Board Members in attendance: Ray Muth, President; Mike Bunting, Treasurer; Frank Barton, Secretary; Bob Meyer, VP Region I; Bill Blochowiak, VP Region III; Julie Cairns, VP Region IV; Cindy Read, Director Region II; Bill Teague, Director Region III. Board Members absent were Molly Moxley, Director Region 1 and George Tookey, Director Region 4.

Secretary Frank Barton called for club delegates present. Eighty-four clubs were present which constituted a quorum.

Ray called on Frank to read the minutes from the 2003 Annual Meeting. Bill Teague moved to accept the minutes as published. This was seconded and approved.

Treasurer Mike Bunting distributed the MNRC Financial Statement and presented the status of the club's finances. Dr. Byrd made a motion to accept the financial report. It was seconded and approved.

Julie Cairns announced that the 2006 Event would be held at California Retriever Training Association grounds in Bakersfield, CA. Marin Retriever Club would be the host club. Dates to be decided.

Bill Blochowiak made a short presentation on the status of the 2005 Event in Tennessee Colony, TX at The Big Woods. Dates to be October 2 through October 9, 2005.

Bill Blochowiak explained the judges selection process as laid out in the MNRC Constitution and By-laws; and the MNRC Policy and Procedure manual.

Ray then asked for the report of the Special Committee to consider whether all or part of the officers and directors of this club should be removed from office. Blair Clark made a motion to remove this item from the agenda. It was seconded and approved.

Ray asked if there was any unfinished business. Bill Teague made a motion for reconsideration of the vote on Amendment # 5 from the previous day. There was a second. After lengthy discussion that involved Delegates, Board Members, and Representatives from the AKC, the motion failed.

Bill Blochowiak presented the slate of judge candidates for the 2005 event. After ballots were counted the following were selected as 2005 judges: Region 1-Sidney Williams; Region 2-Wilfred McAnespy; Region 3 - Russ Reavis; Region 4 - Janet Peters.

Election of Officers and Directors: Bill Blochowiak nominated Bill Teague as Region 3 VP. A motion was made to close nominations. This was seconded and approved. A motion was made to elect Bill by acclamation. This was seconded and approved.

Bill Teague submitted his resignation as Region 3 Director.

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New Judges Nomination Procedure

One of the tasks the Board undertook this winter was to develop a standardized policy for the judges nomination procedure. Clubs from all regions will now receive the same nomination letter and forms. The club researched all eight point Master judges on the AKC judges list for their eligibility to judge the event. When a person's status was unknown letters were sent out. Over 200 letters were sent to judges all over the country asking them if they had run the event and their amateur status. Second letters were sent out to nonrespondants with the stipulation that a no reply indicated to us that they were not eligible to judge the event. The result of this research is that clubs will now only receive a list of eligible judges. We are human and realize there may be errors. The Judges Selection Policy is included here in its entirety.

JUDGES SELECTION

The formal selection of event judges is done by the delegates of the member clubs at the annual business meeting for the next year's event. It is the intent of the Board to bring forth the best qualified slate of judges each year for presentation to the delegates. The Board actually acts as a pre-screening of potential judges to assure they are qualified and can mentally and physically perform the duty of judging our event. The Board receives prospective names from the judges selection committee, which consists of the first vice-president and the 4 regional directors. This committee receives nominations of potential judges from our member clubs and confirms that each is willing and able to judge.

The basic qualifications are to have judged 8 (eight) Master Hunt Tests (can be less if the Board decides so), be an amateur, be in good standing with the AKC, be thoroughly experienced in the training, handling, and requirements of retriever work, and must have handled a dog at our event or previously judged the event. Each judge is selected by the clubs in their region only. No member of the Master National Board of Directors is eligible to judge. There will be no nominations accepted from the floor.

Additionally any prospective judge must be current on their AKC judge's seminar through the date of the event. Judges with expired dates or seminars dates that expire before the event must attend a seminar no later than March of the year they have been selected to judge or else forfeit that judging assignment.

The requirements for judging eight Master hunt tests is verified by the 1st vice president and regional directors between Nov 30 and Jan 15 from information obtained on the AKC web site. This means that a prospective judge must

have the eight points prior to December 31 of the year before they are nominated. The information of eligible 8-point judges is stored and updated on the Master National 8-point judge database. If there is a question about the accuracy of AKC's records or our database it is the responsibility of the individual in question to correct such records prior to being considered qualified to judge.

The regional directors shall obtain the current names and addresses of member club contacts from the treasurer by March 15. Late dues and contact names received after that date shall be sent to the appropriate regional director. Nomination letters shall be sent to the club contacts only. Form letters to club contacts and nominated judges for use by all directors are included. (Templates for these letters can be obtained from the 1st vice president and will also be stored with the secretary's data.) All nominations must be sign by the club contact and either the club president or secretary.

Timeline for nomination process:

- Letters to club contacts sent by March 15 and due back by April 30.
- Letters to nominated judges sent by May 10 and due by June 25
- Board finalizes slate by July 15
- The slate of judges must be published in the notice of the annual meeting.

Guidelines for slate selection by the board

The slate of judges shall consist of 2-3 names per region. These should be the best qualified judges. In addition to the responses of the prospective judge's questionnaire, the Board should take into account how well individuals work with others, quality of judging experience and overall health. Number of club nominations or just knowing names should not be a standard for selection. The Board should listen to the recommendations of the board members of the region of each judge in question. Nominated judges that otherwise meet the eligibility requirements, but have seminar dates that are five or more years old will not be given consideration unless the seminar requirement is updated immediately.

Judges for additional divisions

In the event that the Master National is divided into three splits, judges for additional divisions will be selected by the Board.

When selected, each judge should be notified by their regional director or vice president as soon as possible by a Board member so they may begin their personal planning.
