We the undersigned respectfully request a Special Meeting of the Master National Retriever Club Board of Directors to update the Bylaws as described below.

The purpose of this change is to provide a way to fairly and equitably manage the size of the annual Master National Invitational Event in order to showcase each year's most accomplished dog/handler teams, and to do so in a cost-effective and efficient manner, both for the Master National Retriever Club, our member clubs and individual participants as well.

This proposal maintains the requirement to pass six (6) weekend Master tests, with the added requirement to demonstrate consistency in earning those Master passes. No changes are proposed for our customary exceptions to this, including qualifying dogs from the previous year's Master National Invitational, Canadian dogs, MNH title holders, or qualifying dogs from the current year's Master Amateur Invitational Event.

This proposal also retains simplicity in the requirements placed on our Alaska participants.

Perhaps most important, this proposal maintains the integrity of a truly national event, where the best-of-the-best gather each year to test their mettle running tests of the highest quality. It fosters community spirit, something our members have celebrated for as long as we can remember, no matter who passes or fails.



SECTION 3. Number of Contestants, Eligibility and Entry Fees

- (a) Contestants shall be limited to the following:
- 1. Qualifying dogs of the previous year's Master National Hunting Retriever Test shall receive credit for two qualifying scores.
- 2. All contestants shall be required to obtain qualifying scores in a minimum of six (6) Master Hunting tests conducted by member clubs. Contestants who enter exclusively in Alaska must obtain qualifying scores in a minimum of four Master tests by member clubs and have an MH title. out of the first eight (8) such Master Hunting tests entered in the qualifying year. Contestants who enter exclusively in Alaska must obtain qualifying scores in a minimum of four Master tests conducted by member clubs out of the first six (6) such Master Hunting tests entered in the qualifying year and have an MH title. Any dog that is scratched from a Master weekend test after being sent for a single bird will be marked as a failure, with the exception of illness, injury, or death of the dog or for bitches who come in season, each case requiring verification by a licensed veterinarian and confirmed by the hunt test committee and/or the judges.
- 3. Dogs, domiciled in Canada, running exclusively in CKC Master Hunt Test events, that passed the most recent CKC Canadian Master National Hunt Test prior to the July 31st MNRC qualifying end date.
- 4. Dogs having passed three prior MNRC annual events are exempt from the requirements of Paragraphs (2) & (3) of this section and are qualified for all future MNRC annual events.
- 5. Qualifying dogs of the current year's Master Amateur Retriever Club (MARC) Hunting Retriever Test shall receive credit for two qualifying scores towards the current year's Master National Retriever Club (MNRC) Hunting Retriever Test, provided that eligibility to enter the current year's MARC event came from MNRC member Clubs during the MNRC qualifying period for the MNRC current year.
- (b) In order to be counted towards the qualifying requirements, hunting tests at which qualifying scores are awarded must have a beginning date falling between August 1 of the year preceding the current National Master Hunting Retriever Test and July 31 of the year of the National Master Hunting Retriever Test.
- (c) Each entrant must pay an entry fee, to be determined by the Board of Directors.
